here are still four months left before the deadline of entry applications. Yet the US team has already confirmed its participation. We hope that other counties will show their interest in our championships, which will be the first in the history of World University Championships. Kazakhstan and the Netherlands would probably like to apply for the next editions of WUC in Speed Skating. We want to do everything possible to uphold the tradition of long track single distance speed skating in the academic environment. Unfortunately, long track speed skating is not in the program at the next Winter Universiades.

This winter season the following competitions have been held on the track in Zakopane: Tatry Mountain Cup, Polish Cup, Polish Championship and Youth Polish Championship. Among the medal winners there were such famous Polish women speed skaters like: Natalia Czerwonka, Luiza Złotkowska, Katarzyna Bachleda-Curuś, Katarzyna Woźniak, Karolina Domańska-Ksyt; and men speed skaters like: Konrad Niedźwiedzki, Zbigniew Bródka, Artur Wąs.

A small introduction for those who have never been to Zakopane – this city is the largest urban center in the immediate vicinity of the Tatra Mountains. It is a large ski resort, which has long been informally called the Polish winter capital. The city is also a significant part of the Tatra National Park.

The population of Zakopane is 27.481 and it covers the area of about 85 km². The average temperature in December is -8 degrees Celsius. The town was founded in 1578. The present mayor is Mr. Janusz Majcher, who will be the honorary host of the championships.
